**Spring/Fall Internship Program** 

#### **About the Association:**

Founded in 1985, the *Latino Judges Association, Inc.*, (formerly known as the Association of Judges of Hispanic Heritage), was created by a group of Latino Judges determined to increase and promote diversity on the bench. The purpose of the Association includes: to serve as a forum to discuss areas of mutual concern among Latino Judges; to encourage judicial service among Latinos; to publicize and recognize achievements of Latino Judges and others; and to educate the public about the judicial system and the role of the Latino Judges.

### **About the Internship Program:**

The Latino Judges Association Spring/Fall Internship Program is an eight-week program that provides law students with a unique **in-person** internship experience during the academic year. During the eight-week program, each intern will spend four weeks in an appellate court (Court of Appeals, Appellate Division or Appellate Term) and four weeks in a trial court (Supreme Court, Civil Court, Criminal Court, Family Court or Housing Court) under the supervision of a Host Judge or Justice assigned to that court. **The Latino Judges Association Spring/Fall Internship Program is open to law students who have completed at least one year of law school.** 

The *Spring 2026 Internship Program* will begin the week of February 2, 2026, and continue for eight weeks through and including the week of March 23, 2026. Interns are expected to commit to 20 hours per week for the full eight-week program. Interns are eligible for academic credit or, upon proof that the intern is not receiving academic credit, a stipend of up to \$2500.

Interns are expected to wear appropriate business attire, to be punctual and to conduct themselves in a professional manner. Intern assignments may include legal research and writing, reviewing/summarizing documents and pleadings, observation of trials/hearings and other proceedings, participation in case conferences, and engaging in special projects and other duties as assigned.
